2. KEY FEATURES OF TANZANIA'S ECOTOURISM MODEL

REVENUE TO LOCAL COMMUNITIES



- The government of Tanzania has established rules which generated revenues should be shared directly to local communities and protect their natural reserves.

VALUE OF UNTOUCHED WILDERNESS



- Preservation of natural ecosystems proves that these areas generate greater value through their natural state than when they are used for industrial purposes.

DIRECT LINK TO COMMUNITIES



- A strong connection to local communities is crucial. Community involvement creates ownership, jobs and ensures fair benefit sharing.

CULTURAL TOURISM PROGRAMS



- Travelers discover authentic local life through cultural tourism programs. All earning support the construction of educational facilities and community infrastructure.

QUALITY OVER QUANTITY



- Tanzania manages visitor numbers through higher value offerings. Quality instead of quantity protects sensitive areas from over-tourism

EDUCATION & AWARENESS



- Visitors learn about natural ecosystems and how nature operates, improving environmental understanding and stewardship.

3. METHODOLOGY

Participant Observation

- We collected study data through participant observation during 45-day mobility in Tanzania.

Semi-Structured Interviews

- They were conducted with local tourism managers to gather in-depth insights on practices and outcomes

4. LESSONS FOR SLOVAKIA

- Establish rules for tourism revenue to support local communities and conservation.
- Recognize the long-term economic value of healthy ecosystems over industrial exploitation.
- Integrate cultural tourism to strengthen local identity.
- Focus on quality, high-value tourism to protect sensitive area.
- Use ecotourism as a tool for environmental education & awareness

5. EXPECTED BENEFITS

- **SOCIAL BENEFITS**:- Stronger local communities through jobs, education and cultural preservation.
- **BIODIVERSITY PROTECTION**:- Better conservation of species and habitats
- **NATURAL BENEFITS**:- Healthy ecosystems provide clean water, climate regulation and resilience
- **ECONOMIC GROWTH**:- Sustainable growth through ecotourism as a long term economic base
